A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING MAYOR AND FISCAL OFFICER TO EXECUTE AN ADDENDUM TO THE AGREEMENT WITH WARREN COUNTY SHERIFF AND WARREN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR POLICE PROTECTION IN THE VILLAGE OF SOUTH LEBANON FOR THE CALENDAR YEARS 2016

WHEREAS, providing public safety is one the most critical functions of local municipal government; and,

WHEREAS, the Village, the Sheriff and the Warren County Commissioners entered into an Agreement for Police Protection dated August 24, 1998, and the Agreement was thereafter amended in 2002, 2006, 2008, 2012, and most recently a three (3) year term to include 2015, 2016, and 2017, and,

WHEREAS, the Sheriff desires to enter into an Addendum to the said Agreement for Police Protection with the Village for the calendar years 2016, thereby amending the Agreement for Police Protection with the only modifications being a three year term and an increase in the cost for the 2016 services, all other terms and conditions shall remain the same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of South Lebanon, Ohio, at least a majority of all members elected thereto concurring:

<u>Section 1</u>. That the Council approves and authorizes the Mayor and Fiscal Officer to execute the Addendum to the Police Protection Agreement for police protection in the Village of South Lebanon for the calendar year 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto.

<u>Section 2</u>. Authorizing the Fiscal Officer to pay invoices relating to the said Addendum once billed and received for police protection services for calendar year 2016 without further action of Council, but further action of Council shall be required prior to paying invoices for 2017.

This memorandum reports on an application received from Network Building & Consulting, LLC, Inc., on behalf of AT&T Wireless, to modify the existing telecommunications tower located on a property at 3472 Lebanon Rd. and accompanies a Resolution granting approval of the application and release of a Special Use Permit.

Background

The installation of new wireless telecommunications towers and modifications to existing towers is regulated by Ordinance Number 2001-13. This Ordinance was adopted on July 23, 2001 to insure that the placement, construction or modification of wireless telecommunications facilities in the Village is consistent with the Village's land use policies. This Ordinance was also intended to minimize the negative impact of wireless telecommunications facilities, establish a fair and efficient process for review and approval of applications, assure an integrated, comprehensive review of environmental impacts of such facilities, and protect the health, safety and welfare of the Village.

Ordinance 2001-13 requires a Special Use Permit be issued for any construction of a new wireless telecommunications facility or modifications made to an existing such facility. Per this Ordinance, the Village Council is the officially designated agency of the Village to whom applications for the aforementioned Special Use Permit must be made, and that is authorized to review, analyze, evaluate and make decisions with respect to granting or not granting, recertifying or not recertifying, or revoking Special Use Permits for such facilities.

Analysis

On December 2, 2015, Network Building & Consulting, LLC submitted an application to modify the existing AT&T antenna on the tower located at 3472 Lebanon Road. FCC rules require local governments to approve cell tower modifications within sixty (60) days of application submittal.

The modifications proposed to be made to the existing wireless communications tower facility are as follows:

1. Installation of a DC power cable and remote radio heads on the AT&T antenna on the existing tower.

The property is located in the R-1 Zoning District. The setback distances and building height restriction pursuant to Section 15.9.6 of the Village Zoning Code are as follows:

Front: 35'; Rear: 40'; Side 10'; Building Height: 35'

The proposed communications building satisfies the setback and building height requirements. Section 16 of Ordinance No. 2001-13 states that a public hearing must be held by Council prior to approval of a Special Use Permit application. Section 16 also states that a public hearing is not required when no increase in height of the wireless communications tower or structure is proposed.

Recommendation

My recommendation to Council is to adopt the Resolution by emergency as submitted, thereby enabling the Village Administrator to approve the application and issue a Special Use Permit:

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN APPLICATION AND ISSUING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT TO NETWORK BUILDING & CONSULTING, LLC FOR MODIFICATIONS TO ITS EXISTING WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS FACILITIES INCLUDING TO ADD REMOTE RADIO HEADS TO THE EXISTING AT&T WIRELESS ANTENNA ON THE TOWER AT 3472 LEBANON ROAD IN THE VILLAGE OF SOUTH LEBANON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Council adopted Resolution No. 2001-13 to insure the placement, construction or modification of wireless telecommunications facilities in the Village is consistent with the Village's land use policies and to minimize the negative impact of such facilities, etc. to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the Village; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2001-13 requires a Special Use Permit be issued for any construction of new wireless telecommunications facilities or modifications, and further designates the Council as the approving authority or issuer of such permits deemed in compliance with the said Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, Section 16 (C) of Ordinance 2001-13 provides if an application for a Special Use Permit is for collocating on an existing Telecommunications Tower or high structure, where no increase in height of the Tower or structure is required, no public hearing will be required prior to the approval of the application; and,

WHEREAS, Section 6409(a) of the Middle Class Tax Relief and Jobs Creation Act of 2012 (known as the "Spectrum Act"), codified in 47 U.S.C. 1455, requires local governments to approve an eligible facilities request for a modification of an existing tower or base station that does not result in a substantial change to the physical dimensions of such tower or base station; and,

WHEREAS, the FCC has interpreted the Spectrum Act to require the local government to approve the application within 60 days of the date on which an applicant submits an application seeking approval for a request for a modification of an existing tower or base station that the local government determines does not result in a substantial change to the physical dimensions of such tower or base station; and,

WHEREAS, on December 2, 2015, Network Building & Consulting, LLC, as agent for AT&T Wireless, filed a Special Permit Application with the Village relating to

collocating on its wireless communications facilities at 3472 Lebanon Road in the Village; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2001-13 allows the Council to delegate or designate other officials of or agents on behalf of the Village to accept, review, analyze, evaluate and make recommendations to Council with respect to applications for such Special Use Permits; and,

WHEREAS, the Village Administrator has completed his analysis and recommendation to Council, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein; and,

WHEREAS, immediate action is required to complete a fair and efficient process as required by Ordinance No. 2001-13 and the timely review as mandated by the aforementioned federal law, and such action is necessary in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety or welfare of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of South Lebanon, at least two-thirds of all members elected thereto concurring:

<u>Section 1</u>. The attached analysis and recommendation of the Village Administrator are hereby adopted by the Council as its findings of fact and conclusions of law.

<u>Section 2</u>. That the Council does hereby approve the Special Use Permit applied for by Network Building & Consulting, LLC, Inc. as agent for AT&T Wireless relating to its wireless communications facilities at 3472 Lebanon Road in the Village.

<u>Section 3</u>. That a certified copy of this Resolution shall be deemed the Special Use Permit.

<u>Section 4</u>. That the Council is acting in its administrative capacity in passing this Resolution.

<u>Section 5.</u> That the recitals contained within the Whereas Clauses set forth above are incorporated by reference herein.

Section 6. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure in accordance with Ohio Rev. Code § 731.30 for the immediate

preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare; and, this Resolution shall be in full force and effective immediately upon its passage.

<u>Section 7</u>. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to passing this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of Council in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

2015 GCWW Water Usage

At the last meeting, the question was asked about the status of "Take or Pay" with our contract with the Greater Cincinnati Water Works (GCWW). The current required minimum annual usage requirement (see attached Exhibit B) is 102,473 CCF's (1 CCF=748 gallons). Based the last two (2) years usage, I am forecasting that the 2015 usage will be 107,086 CCF.

The minimum usage goes up to 112,233 CCF in 2017. To meet this number, we'll need to add the equivalent of 81 to 93 homes by 2017. With the new developments in the works, we should meet or exceed this requirement through calendar year 2019.

Our current rate with GCWW is \$1.86/CCF (\$0.0025/gal).
