5. **ORDINANCE 2025-23,** AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2024-23 AND APPROVING REVISIONS TO THE MINIUMUM AND MAXIMUM PAY RATES OF THE CITY'S COMPENSATION PAY SCALE AS PART OF THE CITY'S PERSONNEL POLICY MANUAL

Allen stated that there was a Personnel Committee meeting on October 29, 2025. She further stated that the Committee made a recommendation to Council to approve revisions to the pay rates of the City's Compensation Pay Scale.

6. **ORDINANCE 2025-24**, AN ORDINANCE SETTING RATES OF COMPENSATION FOR FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF SOUTH LEBANON

Haddix stated that the compensation rates are for full-time employees' pay, which is not set by City Council.

Mayor Burke corrected classified employees to all full-time employees' pay which is not set by City Council.

Williams stated that the Personnel Committee met on October 29, 2025, to discuss employee health benefits. Discussed that due to the significant increase in health premiums received from Anthem (27.27% in 2025 and 20.3% in 2024), administration has been exploring alternative solutions to help lower our health insurance costs for both the employee and the city. Stated that the Personnel Committee made a recommendation to switch to the new health insurance plan.

Allen discussed that the Personnel Committee reviewed various health insurance plans. Discussed the City's 60% front load contribution to a Health Savings Account. Further discussing employees saving on deductibles and out-of-pocket expenses.

Williams stated that if Council passes Resolution 2025-44, meetings with employees will be held to discuss the health insurance coverage changes.

Mayor Burke stated that the City will save significantly by joining the Center for Local Government Insurance Pool

A motion to waive the two-reading rule was made by Combs, seconded by Fedor, all yeas. By title only, Resolution 2025-44, a motion to adopt was made by Allen, second by Fedor, all yeas.

10. **RESOLUTION-2025-45**, AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A HIGH-DEDUCTIBLE HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN AND EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS TO HEALTH SAVINGS ACCOUNTS FOR FULL-TIME CITY EMPLOYEES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

A motion to waive the two-reading rule was made by Allen, seconded by Combs, all yeas. By title only, Resolution 2025-45, a motion to adopt was made by Harrison, second by Carmack, all yeas.
